## International Women’s Day Dinner Brings Awareness

March 8 is marked as International Women’s Day which is a global day celebrating the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women. The first International Women’s Day gathering was in 1911 and was attended by well over a million people.

The day also marks a call to action for accelerating gender parity, says Kat Autenrieth, Regional Director of North American Brownfields Exploration for Kinross Gold USA, pictured directly below, second from left. Kat prepared a presentation on International Women’s Day for various meetings and classes at RMGC. In an industry whose roles are mainly filled by men, deliberate or unconscious bias can make it difficult for women to move ahead. Kat explained that both men and women are biased and that we must not place blame, but work together to raise awareness of what women deal with on a regular basis. This affects some women more than others, in particular wom-

en in traditionally male roles, which is often seen in the mining industry.

To bring about awareness and change means to take action in the workplace. Kat urges people to notice situations that are biased and challenge what is being said. Listen to what women have to say about their experiences and believe them when they speak up about a biased situation. Other ways to support gender equality and acceptance is to stop gossip, harmful language and labels.

Kinross Round Mountain hosted a dinner on March 8 at Blitz Creek to honor and celebrate women in the mining industry. ## Community Champion

This issue's Community Champion is Sonja Miller. Sonja is the principal of Round Mountain K-12 Schools. Sonja is originally from Germany, but has been in the US for 30 years. She began her education career as a special education teacher, then moved into administration. In 2017, Sonja and her husband Jim relocated to Round Mountain from Pahrump after falling in love with the area on a visit north. Since then, Sonja has dedicated herself to the school and the community. Sonja loves the closeness of this community. She loves the way people look out for each other here. She loves the seclusion of Smoky Valley and how little influence the outside world has on us. "Our kids have the rare opportunity to grow up with a freedom which no longer exists in other places," she said. One of the traits of the school culture that Sonja has been able to foster is a close relationship among staff, students and teachers. "Our teachers have the opportunity to really get to know their students and tailor instructions to individual students," she said. She is proud of the fact that staff and students are proactive in problem solving and care about their friends and each other. "I am extremely proud of our staff and students and feel very blessed to work with such amazing people," added Sonja. Looking ahead, Sonja said the school is working on ensuring our state rating reflects our growth. "It is my hope that parents and students will be proud of our school," she added. There are some projects in the far future that include improvements to our facilities. Next year's goal will focus on community and parent involvement. "With the input of our staff, students, and parents, we will take our school to the next level!"

## RMHS J4NG Program

Jobs for America's Graduates, or JAG, is a nationwide program created to mentor and support students to build a bright future. For over 40 years, JAG programs have been running in 39 states in the U.S.

In Nevada, the JAG programs are referred to as J4NG, or Jobs For Nevada's Graduates. Located within schools, J4NG identifies students whose grades have dropped, attendance declined, or they ran into disciplinary problems. With this extra support, 96% of J4NG students graduate from high school. Without J4NG, the aforementioned students' success would be in jeopardy.

In addition to identifying and mentoring students to acquire a high school diploma, J4NG is a gateway to career pathways. J4NG commits to following students for a year post high school, which is a very unique quality. The program introduces students to opportunities in full-time employment, trade school options, or full-time college. According to J4NG.org, the program costs under \$1,400 per students per year and provides a minimum of 120 contact hours per student per year.

Kinross Round Mountain saw the potential of the program in Round Mountain and funded its existence at Round Mountain High School 3 years ago. Currently, the J4NG coordinator at RMHS is Kenndra Larsen. Kenndra teaches life skills and career preparation skills. They explore skills from the importance of a firm handshake to career paths to applying for scholarships.

Students also get the opportunity to hear from guest speakers from a variety of vocations. Learning about career options opens up opportunities for the future. "We plan on hosting at least two guest speakers a month," says Kenndra. So far this year the RHMS J4NG program has hosted several guest speakers, including Cale Dolan, Chase Diller, Samantha Faga and Nicole Silberschlag. Sam is the "go to" gal for the RMHS J4NG program, and Nicole spoke with the students about her path and how it lead to her career with Kinross. "It's important to me that these kids hear outside voices on real life stories," said Kenndra. "Cookie cutter lives are not real thing, but hard work and perseverance are what pays off," she continued.
