MTC Scholarship Recipients Head to Great Basin College



The two MTC Scholarship recipients spent the summer working for RMGC before heading off to Elko to join their programs at Great Basin College. The Maintenance Training Cooperative, or MTC, offers young men and women an opportunity to learn a trade in one of five fields: Diesel Technology, Electrical Systems, Industrial Millwright, Instrumentation Technology and Welding. The programs are 48 weeks long and fast paced. The scholarship covers their full tuition, with the exception of books and housing. In addition, upon graduation the MTC program students have the opportunity to come back to RMGC for employment.

Pictured above is MTC Scholarship recipient Adrian McLucas from Eureka. Adrian loves working with his hands and repairing things—mechanical and otherwise. He is excited to begin his schooling at Great Basin. “I’ve always loved working on vehicles and other trucks growing up. I believe that diesel trucks are essential in our economy and will continue to be in the future,” said Adrian. After finishing his year at GBC Adrian plans on returning to work for Kinross Nevada. Adrian has also enjoyed his summer employment before his program begins. “So far working here has been amazing and a really fun experience. My co-workers in the shop are amazing and a pleasure to work with, teaching me skills for the work we do,” said Adrian.

Nikolas will be studying diesel technology and welding at Great Basin. His desire to further his career as a mechanic is what motivated him to apply. “My goals are to get my diesel tech and welding certifications and then join the Army in about 5 years,” Nikolas said. He has had a very positive experience here for the summer and looks forward to coming back full time. “So far I have enjoyed the experience I have been given and am very thankful for the opportunity. I cannot wait to come back full time,” he commented.

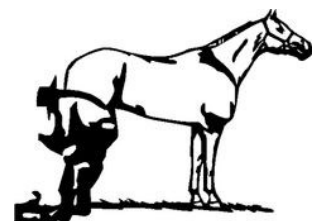
